My name is Patricia Richey and I am a student and soon-to-be Licensed Direct-entry Midwife in Oregon. I'm also a mother of six children. My goal in becoming a midwife was to help women have multiple safe maternity care and birth options for the optimal care of women and babies. I want these options for this kind of care available to my daughters if/when they have children.

Midwives are well trained to provide safe and excellent care in support of normal physiological birth and therefore support positive birth and health outcomes for both mamas and babies. Unfortunately, as a student I've already had the opportunity to see how insurance has become a barrier in helping women to get the care that they desire and need. HB 2845 would increase access to midwifery care for Oregon families whether they choose a hospital birth, birth center birth or homebirth with Licensed Direct-Entry Midwives, Certified Nurse Midwives, or Naturopathic Physicians.
