To whom it may concern:
I am writing to strongly oppose House Bill 3063 which would remove all nonmedical exemptions to vaccines in children. I am a mother of two, a biologist, and a concerned citizen. I am not an "anti-vaxxer". I am pro-informed consent.
I believe it is critically important to retain our right to choose which invasive medical procedures we undertake, and those that our children undertake. Requiring that every child receive EVERY vaccine does not take into account individual and family health, risks, and genetics. It also does not take into account very real concerns that parents have with the bloated CDC vaccination schedule. There have been no studies comparing the health of vaccinated to unvaccinated children. Vaccinating carries risk. The National Vaccine Injury Compensation Fund has paid out billions of dollars in damages to families of children injured by vaccines.
