

Hello -

My name is Gwendolyn Terra and I am an Oregon resident who lives in Talent, Oregon.

I am writing to voice my clear opposition to HB 3063.

I am a mother, and a citizen, who provides healing services with others.

I believe the right to go to school for all children is part of our educational system.

I also am aware that each person and body has different responses and reactions to medical procedures and drug. I believe we have a basic right to what we put into our bodies and into the bodies of our children. If you read the info sheet that comes with the chemicals and possible side effects of vaccines, they do have a risk of severe damage (the CDC pays out those damages) to people including many children who have received vaccines. There have been billions of dollars paid out for damages, so we know they are dangerous

There is a medical risk, including death for some vaccines. If there is a risk, we have the right to make a choice.

Often it is not till after the vaccines that the damage is known, so there is not medical evidence before hand to make a "safe" choice.

Doctors are learning as well. There is a lot of research in this area across the world and it is complex. I appreciate the desire to create safer communities. But the truth is we could go to a bathroom in a public place and get a disesa

In regards to vulnerable populations, they are at risk when people receive vaccinations because they are shedding. Also, every child counts, and putting some children risk so that others will be safe is not the only solution.

The educational system in Oregon already has guidelines if there are disease outbreaks for those that not vaccinated. In the most recent case it was unvaccinated (and they chose that and were willing to get measles, and now have a permanent immunity) and vaccinated people who got measles.

We can't stop all diseases, and creating policy that is blanket and based on fear, not taking into account that individuals respond to different medicines in different ways is in violation of our basic human rights.

It also creates a lot of us and them fear dynamics (my daughter has already been getting pressured and shamed by other students for the choice not to vaccinate).

We already have laws, and for those who choose not to vaccinate a process for them to learn the risk. I feel it would be more fair for peopl who are vaccinated to also learn the risk for themselves and their children.
