## RE: HB 2329 EFSC Jurisdiction on Energy Facilities

Dear Chair Helm and Members of the Committee:

For the record, my name is Roger Kaye, current President of Friends of Marion County. Friends of Marion County is a 501(c)(3) farmland protection organization founded in 1998. Our mission is to protect farm and forestland, parks, and open space.

Our organization opposes this proposal for the following reasons:

- 1. Protection of High-value farmland is a top priority and this bill would undercut those protections. While we are most concerned about high-value farmland, we are also concerned about the conversion of other farmland, including high-quality grazing land, grape-growing land and dry land wheat lands, for energy development.
- 2. Marion County established a work group and decided that the protection of HVF and solar power generation were incompatible on these lands.
- 3. The LCDC compromised by permitting solar arrays on lower class soils while protecting Class I, II, Prime and Unique soils.
- 4. LCDC also permitted Dual-use arrays/farming which expands the footprint to 20 acres on lower class soils.
- 5. Our organization has been active in several recent issues in Marion County and in our estimation Marion County even with a 2017-2018 budget of \$450MM, is not in the position to deal with all of the conflicts that EFSC would be able to address in a permitting process.
- 6. At the time of the Enron debacle, we testified in Marion County about a proposed gas-fired power plant. It was very clear that EFSC was well positioned to manage this application. Marion County, without the necessary resources could not accomplish this process.
