SUMMARY—Requires certain pharmacies to provide a prescription reader upon request. (BDR 54-665)

AN ACT relating to pharmacies; requiring each retail community pharmacy in this State to provide a prescription reader upon the request of a person to whom a drug is dispensed; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law requires prescriptions to be dispensed in a container to which is affixed a label or other device that contains certain information unless otherwise specified by the prescribing practitioner. (NRS 639.2801) This bill requires a retail community pharmacy that dispenses a drug to: (1) notify the person to whom the drug is dispensed of the availability of a prescription reader; and (2) upon request, provide a prescription reader to the person free of charge.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Chapter 639 of NRS is hereby amended by adding 2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, a retail
 community pharmacy shall notify each person to whom a drug is
 dispensed that a prescription reader is available to the person free
 of charge. The retail community pharmacy shall, upon request
 and free of charge:

 (a) Provide a prescription reader to the person to whom the

9 drug is dispensed to use for at least the duration of the 10 prescription; and





1 (b) Ensure that the label or other device attached to the 2 container of the drug is capable of conveying the information prescribed in NRS 639.2801 to a person using the prescription 3 4 reader. The requirements of subsection 1 do not apply if: 5 2. 6 (a) The drug is not dispensed in a container to which is affixed 7 a label or other device pursuant to NRS 639.2801; or (b) The drug is dispensed through the mail. 8 3. As used in this section: 9 10 (a) "Prescription reader" means a device designed to convey audibly the information contained on the label or other device 11 affixed to the container of a prescription drug to a person who is 12 13 visually impaired or otherwise would have difficulty reading the 14 lahel. (b) "Retail community pharmacy" means a pharmacy that is licensed by the Board and dispenses drugs directly to the general 15 16 public at retail prices. The term does not include: 17 18 (1) A pharmacy that dispenses prescription medications to 19 patients solely through the mail; (2) A nonprofit pharmacy designated by the Board 20 21 pursuant to NRS 639.2676; 22 (3) An institutional pharmacy; (4) A pharmacy in a correctional institution; or 23 (5) A pharmacy operated by a governmental entity. 24 25 **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective on January 1, 2018.
