I am asking that you not put forth HB3063. This bill discriminates against a group of people who have serious concerns about vaccines. Especially, to those whose children were injured by vaccines. It looks like an attempt to coerce citizens of Oregon to do something they believe is dangerous or against their religious beliefs.

This bill impacts our family personally. Back in 2000, our first born son was growing and thriving and healthy. He was meeting all the milestones for his age at one. I didn't question my doctor or the CDC for that matter and had given him all the required vaccines at that time. He had begun to walk and was doing great. Then we took him in for the chickenpox vaccination and within the week he was very sick, with a temperature of 104 degrees. He was lethargic and not his active self.
