Subject: Please postpone the public hearing for HB 3063

Dear Rep. Salinas,

I am a Bend resident with a Biology degree and a R.N. degree. I would like to attend the public hearing on HB 3063, but can not get there due to impassable roads. **I urge you to postpone this hearing until roads are passable so that interested people across the state may attend this hearing.** If you will not postpone the hearing, I would like my testimony heard over the phone.

This bill will affect the personal freedoms of Oregonians. I am dumbfounded that the state that I grew up in, in the country that professes to love freedom, would consider not letting my children attend school unless I consent to have them injected with chemicals that I believe are harmful. I have personally seen two severe vaccine injuries: a man who was completely paralyzed from a flu vaccine, and a toddler who developed thrombocytopenia, an inability to make platelets that can cause a person to bleed to death. Vaccine injuries are not that rare and the idea of the state mandating a personal medical decision is appalling. The National Vaccine Injury Compensation Board has paid \$3,754,128,915.24 to persons who spent years in court to prove that they had a severe vaccine injury or death of a family member.

Please postpone this hearing so that it will have proper public representation from across the state. I have attached a few items for your consideration.
