My name is Beatrice Pickett and I am a proud Oregonian from Portland. I am currently studying as an undergraduate at Yale University, where I plan to pursue a double-major in environmental studies and political science. I became passionate about environmental issues at a young age and I remain committed to advocating for sustainable energy solutions and climate justice. I am writing today to urge you to pass HB 2020 in order to address the climate crisis and position Oregon as an environmental leader in the twenty-first century economy.

As a young person who will feel the burden of climate change for the remaining decades of my life, I am deeply worried about the devastation that is inevitable if we continue on our current emissions trajectory.
