Dear Representatives and Health Care Committee Members,

We oppose HB 3063.

My family and I live here in Oregon and we believe any bill that would attempt to limit health choice or vaccine choice is unconstitutional. To require someone to take a vaccine or to limit their option to refuse one is an attempt to displace body autonomy and health freedom.

Nothing medical is ever one size fits all and vaccines should not be forced or required for children to attend school. There is plenty of evidence showing that vaccines may not even work as claimed and may not even be effective to begin with. Do not attempt to mandate such a potentially defective product in such a way.

Vaccines are inherently fraught with documented failings and incredible conflicts of interest. For example; the pharmaceutical companies, doctors and doctor's offices have absolutely no liability for their use, increased recommendations or the cumulative affects of vaccines. The combined schedule of vaccines has not been fully studied as administered. And true double blind studies have never been done.
