Dear Co-Chair Dembrow, Co-Chair Power, members of the Joint Carbon Reduction Committee,

My name is David Michael Smith and I am a resident of Forest Grove. I have lived in Oregon since 1979. When I returned from serving in Vietnam almost 50 years ago, one of the stories I covered as I began a career in journalism was the growing irrefutable evidence of climate change. After half a century of ignoring those concerns and kicking solutions into the future for others to deal with -- here we are. My 3-year-old granddaughter is about to inherit a world where the effects of climate change are in full evidence, where we have been warned that we have but a short time left to avoid irreversible disaster.
