Dear Representatives,

My name is Dr. Kacie Flegal, I am a Chiropractic Physician practicing in Ashland, OR.

I am writing you in regard to Bill HB 3063 that seeks to remove all exemptions except medical exemptions for vaccines.

I am deeply concerned about this bill and would like to express my opposition to it. I urge you to oppose this bill for the following reasons:

1) Mandating vaccination and removing the right to be exempt due to philosophical or religious reasons will impact the current 31,521 students in OR who are enrolled and have filed a non-medical exemption. Since SB-277 California has significantly suffered with declining enrollment.


Mitch Greenlick's bill will require parents to comply with every vaccine on the Oregon Health Authority's schedule, and any future vaccines added (expect to see Flu and HPV very soon). If they don't, their child will not be able to attend school in Oregon.



2) Currently, Oregon has extremely high MMR rates across all counties.

The Oregon Health Authority just released MMR vaccination rates by county in Oregon, leading to an obvious question: why do we need a new law to force parents to vaccinate?



Why is the actual vaccination rate for MMR and what the media is reporting so different? Why doesn't the Oregon Health Authority ever correct the media?



3) 7.5% of kindergarteners file an exemption form, which means they could be exempt from ONE vaccine, not ALL vaccines. Most of them will continue to vaccinate.

- 4) Only 2.5% of kindergarteners are 100% unvaccinated, therefore, of those that have filed an exemption, 66% are partially or mostly fully vaccinated. (2.6% of the 7.5% of exemptions did no vaccines, leaving 4.9% who did vaccinate even with exemption. 4.9%/7.5% = 65%)
- 5) Having exemption in Oregon means that the student didn't receive ALL 31 of the 31 required vaccines for school attendance. Meaning that if a child received 30 of the required vaccines, they would still be under the exemption.
- 6) The current measles cases since January of 2019 in Oregon is 4. 3 of which were confirmed to have stayed home during the illness and pose NO RISK of new public exposures. There has not been a single case of measles spread in any public or private school since this time. There is no state of emergency.


Measles has been confirmed in three more Multnomah County residents, bringing the total number of cases in Oregon to 4. Officials say the three individuals stayed home and pose no risk of new public exposures. The individuals were in close contact with a Multnomah County resident who tested positive for measles on January 25. These cases are linked to an outbreak in Washington state.

Most Oregonians have been vaccinated against measles, and their risk is low. Measles is a highly contagious viral disease that spreads easily to people who are not immune. It poses the highest risk to pregnant women, infants under 12 months of age and people with weakened immune systems.

7) Measles cases still happen even when vaccine rates are at their peak. You will see from this chart from the CDC that this current outbreak of measles is not out of the cyclical norm for the disease.
