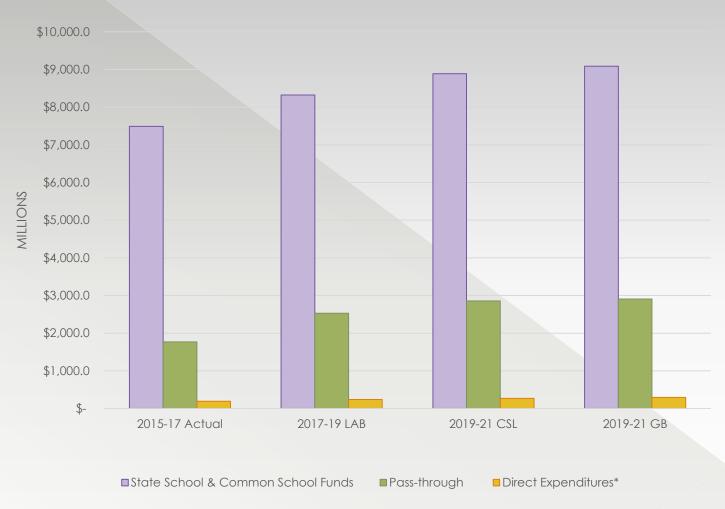

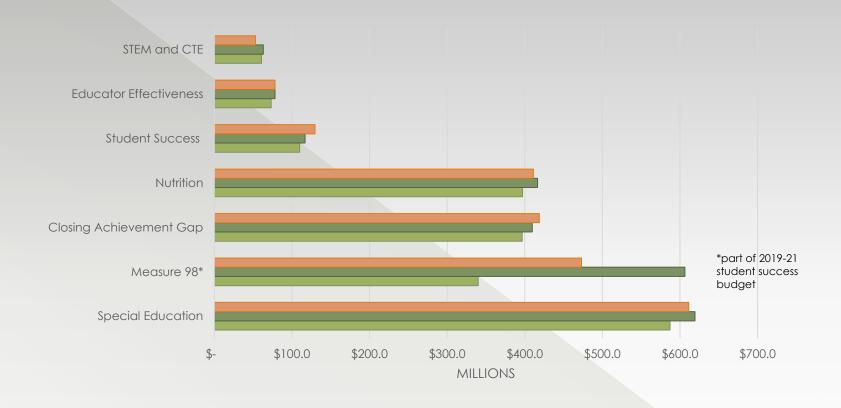

## Department of Education Pass-through K-12 Grant In Aid (Total Funds)

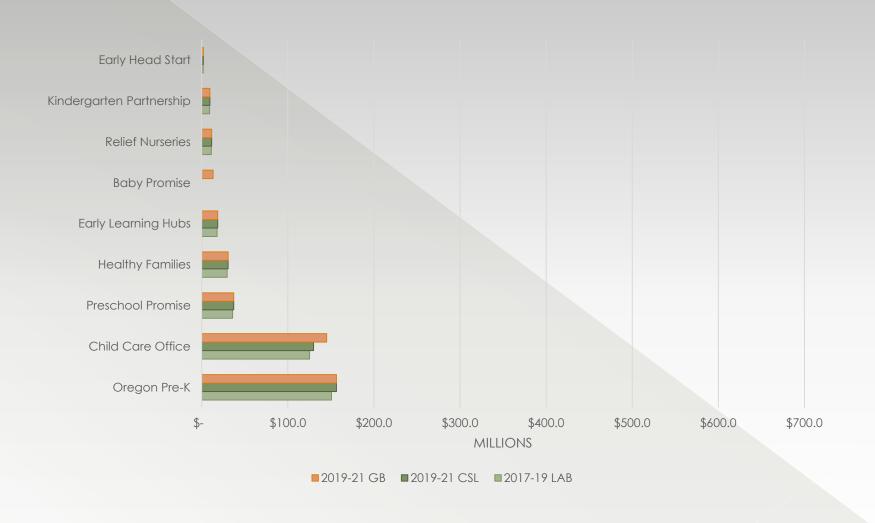

2019-21 Governor's Budget - Investments Cont.



- Infrastructure (\$104.0 million, 14.40 FTE)
  - High quality and safe school facilities
  - Nutritional needs of all students
  - > Adequate business services
  - Early Learning staff capacity
- State School Fund (\$200.9 million)
  - Return to 49/51 percent split between first and second year
  - Use final gross PERS rate

## Department of Education 2019-21 Governor's Budget



- Standard statewide increase to vacancy savings for Operations and School for the Deaf, adjustments for Attorney General rates and State Government Service Charges
- Reductions to Grant-In Aid
  - > Eliminated program funding for Vision Screening and Farm to School
  - > Reductions to Measure 98, CTE/STEM and Regional Programs
  - Reductions to CTE/STEM and Nutrition programs
  - Program funding shifted from Supporting Accelerated Learning Opportunities to Regional Promise
  - > Fund shifts for Special Education Fund (One-Time), including Hospital Education, Long Term Care and Treatment, and Blind and Visually Impaired
  - Reduce Other Funds and Federal Funds to match expenditure levels
