My name is Darby Ayers-Flood, and I am the Mayor of Talent, speaking on my own behalf in support of strengthening HB2020.

In the past few years, residents of Talent have come together to start implementing concrete steps towards transitioning our city to clean energy and greater energy efficiency.

Talent residents have developed and implemented energy efficiency programs, developed a clean energy plan for the city and are working to try to get the first community solar projects moving. Our community has set bold goals, including 100% clean energy by 2030.
