

**HB 2086 A STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY**

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**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:**

Revises Oregon Agricultural Heritage Program definitions and terminology related to purpose, administration, and eligibility criteria of the program. Modifies purpose of the working land conservation covenant and easement from to "support" land for agricultural production to "preserve and protect" land for agricultural production. Removes authority of Oregon Agricultural Heritage Commission (Commission) to adopt rules and specifies that the Commission recommends to the Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board the adoption of program rules. Expands eligible applicants for grants from 501(c)(3) not-for-profit corporations to any not-for-profit organization other than a state agency.

**BACKGROUND:**

The Oregon Agricultural Heritage Program and Oregon Agricultural Heritage Commission (Commission) were established by the legislature in 2017 to provide voluntary incentives to farmers and ranchers to support practices that maintain or enhance both agriculture and natural resources on agricultural lands. In 2018, the Commission engaged in rulemaking related to program administration, technical assistance, farm and ranch succession planning, working land covenants and easements, and conservation management planning. Rulemaking was completed and approved by the Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board in January of 2019.
