

HB 2026 -1 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Extends sunset on pilot program relating to trauma informed approaches to June 30, 2022. Amends current reporting requirement. Requires report on preliminary evaluation of program by June 30, 2020. Requires second report no later than June 30, 2022. Transfers program from Chief Education Office to Oregon Department of Education. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

REVENUE: No revenue impact

FISCAL: Fiscal impact issued

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Impact of trauma informed care on student absenteeism and graduation rates
- Impact of pilot program on chronically absent students

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

-1 Appropriates \$2,500,000 out of the General Fund beginning July 1, 2019.

REVENUE: No revenue impact

FISCAL: Fiscal impact issued

BACKGROUND:

HB 4002 (2016) and SB 182 (2016) conduct a three-year pilot program, called Trauma Informed Practices, to mitigate Adverse Childhood Experiences.

HB 2026 extends the sunset on the trauma informed pilot program to June 30, 2022. It transfers the program from the Chief Education Office to the Oregon Department of Education and adds reporting requirements.
