Re: <u>SB 861</u> – Requires state to pay for ballot return envelopes – Comments

The League of Women Voters has consistently urged to remove barriers to voting, from Oregon's automatic voter registration to our vote by mail. This bill calls for pre-paid ballot envelopes. We would like to see improvement in our voter turnout and this would help. Washington State noted an <u>8% increase</u> in voting when ballot postage was paid last year. They are discussing paying for ballot envelopes statewide too.

Some established League members are reluctant to support this, citing the \$2.7 million cost, already allocated in the <u>Governor's budget</u>, page 301. League members are generally comfortable using stamps and paying the current \$0.55 cost for each.

We appreciate that this bill could improve voter turnout for these populations:

- Young voters. Many are unfamiliar with postage stamps and do not usually use them.
- Low-income voters. The cost of the current \$0.55 stamp, or more for heavier ballots, may deter voting for them and other members of their households, weighing budget impact.
- Rural voters. Many ballots are deposited in dropboxes, which may not be nearby and can be less accessible, compared to many urban areas.

We urge careful consideration of these factors.
