The mission of Oregon's Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program is to protect individual rights, enhance quality of life, improve care, and promote dignity of residents living in Oregon's licensed long-term care facilities. Program staff work with a statewide network of 160 - 200 volunteers annually who work in their own communities to achieve this mission.


## The Ombudsman Program by the Numbers

#### In Oregon:

Statewide coverage provided via 6 districts;

45,000 Oregonians live in long-term care facilities;

170 - 200 trained volunteers investigate and resolve complaints.

visits to residents living in long-term care facilities



Volunteers gave **26,122** volunteer hours.

Volunteers visit their assigned facilities weekly, making them the most consistent and frequent State presence in a long-term care facility and uniquely able to identify potential issues involving resident safety, service quality, protection of rights and environmental factors.

The **three** most frequent complaints handled by ombudsmen were:

- Improper eviction or inadequate discharge;
- Administration and organization of medications; and
- Quality, quantity, variation, and choice of food.

#### 35 Volunteers

- Regular visits to 80 facilities and 4,812 residents.
- 6,230 donated hours of service.

- ❖ Approximately 175 volunteers in 2018.
- ❖ Volunteer hours equivalent to 28 FTE.
- ❖ Annual savings to the State of \$1.6 million in wages, OPE, and services and supplies.
