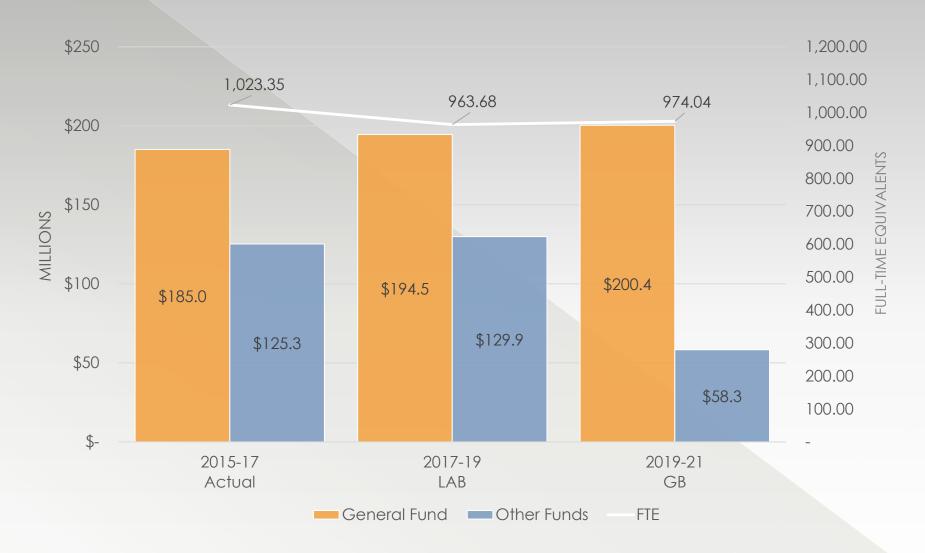


Emerging issues

Department of Revenue Expenditure History + 2019-21 Governor's Budget



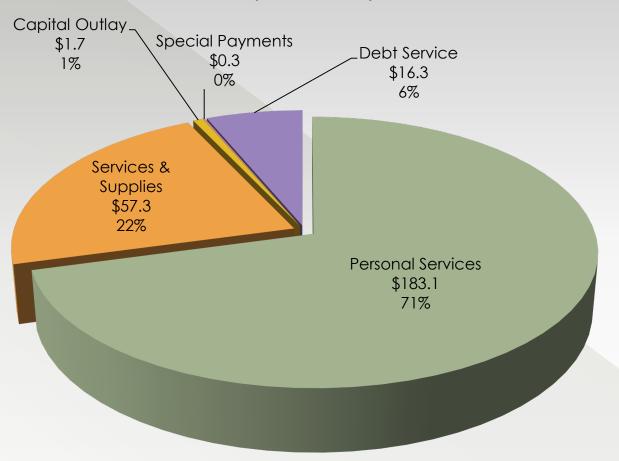

Department of Revenue Revenue Sources



- The Department is expected to collect \$20.5 billion General Fund during 2019-21
- Most of the agency's budget (77 percent) is General Fund
- Other Funds come from:
 - Charges against Other Funds taxes and fees the Department of Revenue administers
 - Collections fees charged to Other Agency Account debtors
 - Property Tax-specific revenue streams funding property tax map maintenance, administration and grants

Maintain Critical Infrastructure

- Sentax maintenance and support (\$4.8 million total funds)
- Processing Center Modernization Project (\$0.8 million total funds)
- Processing Center Permanent Staff for Statewide Payroll Tax (\$1.5 million Other Funds, 11 positions)
- > Outcome Based Management position (\$0.3 million total funds)

Revenue Generating Capacity

- Property Tax Positions (\$1.1 million General Fund, \$2.3 million Other Funds)
- Marijuana Tax Auditors (\$0.9 million Other Funds, four positions)
- > Hotel Tax Auditor (\$0.2 million Other Funds)
- > Financial Institutions Data Match fees (\$0.2 million total funds)

Investments (continued)

- > Implement Heavy Equipment Rental Tax (\$0.9 million Other Funds)
- Implement Employer Responsibility Assessment (\$1.0 million General Fund)
- > Shift of \$70.0 million in Special Payments to Revenue Transfers

Reductions and Statewide Adjustments

- Reimbursement to counties for the Nonprofit Housing for the Elderly Property Tax Exemption (\$3.2 million General Fund)
- Reduce positions in information technology, filing enforcement, customer service (\$1.9 million General Fund)
- Increased agency vacancy rate to 5.0 percent, eliminated Services and Supplies inflation, eliminate long-term vacant positions, eliminate obsolete contracts (\$5.1 million General Fund)
- > Updates to the Department of Administrative Services Price List and State Government Services Charges
