I am concerned with the follow:

- What extra training do dentists have to administer vaccines?
- Most clinics or doctors' offices request that the patient stay onsite for a short time after vaccination to watch for reactions. If this occurs in a dental office what measures or training will the office have to deal with the reaction?
- Do dental offices have the proper storage for vaccines?
