HB 3063 Amendment Proposal

- 1. Grandfather clause on all Personal Belief Exemptions until end of 2019/2020 school year.
- 2. Bill is effective start of 2020/21 school year.
- 3. Vaccine checkpoints occur for every child at Kindergarten and 7th entry.
- 4. Medical exemptions shall be made at the full discretion of the child's medical provider (MD, ND, OD) and not restricted to the CDC contradictions. The medical provider can exempt a child from vaccination when the child's medical provider concludes that there are circumstances, including but not limited to, family medical history, for which the medical provider does not recommend vaccination.
- 5. Religious exemptions can be obtained without the approval of a Doctor or Clergy. The morality of being forced to use products that contain aborted fetal cells, as well as animal DNA, should never be mandated. Supreme Court has upheld "sincerely held religious beliefs" to the same scrutiny as any organized religion.
- 6. Students requiring special education services from the state especially IEP (Federally protected), 504, and TAG students should be exempted from the rule and follow the current vaccine mandate and optout system.
- 7. Conditional enrollment for children needing to catch up on vaccines. The medical provider can write a letter stating the child will be receiving the "needed" vaccines but on a spread out schedule safer for the child.
- 8. This bill excludes private, parochial, online schools and homeschooled children.
- 9. OHA must report the incidence of every disease that must be vaccinated for and indicate vaccine status of the people who contracted the disease.
- 10. Required vaccines are fixed/as is upon the introduction of HB 3063. Vaccines post the introduction of HB 3063 are recommended, not required. Required vaccines to be limited to illnesses communicable in school settings. Tetanus, HPV, and Hepatitis B are not "herd immunity" diseases and cannot be contracted while engaging in school/school activities.
