What is the ORSN? The College of Education's (COE) Oregon Research Schools Network (ORSN) is an effort to improve the academic and career outcomes for youth through collaborative partnerships between University of Oregon faculty members and on-site practitioners, primarily teachers, in high schools across the state. Stakeholder input and collaboration from teachers, educational leaders, students, families and the community is critical to the success of the network. ORSN will extend services (professional development), instruction (dual credit classes) and field initiated research into schools statewide. The ultimate outcome for ORSN is to increase the graduation rate for Oregon's students.
