These factory farms disregard all the qualities many Oregonians seek in a viable agricultural system: healthy animals that spend time on pasture, consume appropriate feed and have a high quality of life; nutrient management that regenerates farmland and is protected from negatively affecting surface water, groundwater and local communities; and economic and social connection to the rural communities they are part of.
