Audits are performed by Sustainable Forestry Initiative (SFI), Forest Stewardship Council (FSC), PricewaterhouseCoopers, a third party auditor for American Tree Farm System (ATFS) which certifies forest landowners in Oregon through Oregon Tree Farm System, Inc. and throughout the country. Oregon forest landowners, have audits just about every year, from the above mentioned programs, which is one way of keeping up with Standards of Sustainability, protection of wildlife, historical sites, water, harvest, planting, and the laws. Oregon's audit is every five years coinciding with the Standards of Sustainability. If there are serious infractions, Oregon may be removed from participating, however, there have never been any since the first tree farm was certified in 1942, (this landowner has since sold the property, no longer certified) and 1944 still certified through Oregon Tree Farm System, Inc.
