I am an Oregon business owner. I own three businesses: a mortgage brokerage, a property management company and a part-time CPA business. I am very concerned with HB 3031 and SB 947.

It is becoming increasingly difficult to do business in Oregon. I feel like the legislature is anti-business, The tax and regulatory burden is excessive. Between the existing paid sick leave law, minimum wage increase, property tax burdens, state transit tax, and reporting requirements, I wonder if it is worthwhile employing 15 people. I am considering decreasing my operations rather than expanding.

I strongly recommend that you vote against these bills. I am sure you are aware that a growing number of Oregon businesses are considering migrating to more business friendly states. I have had friends move their families and businesses to Idaho. I came to Oregon forty-nine years ago. I love the state, but I am increasingly concerned with anti-business decisions, e.g. rent controls, coming out of the legislature. It will not take too much more for me and my companies to leave the state.
