As I understand it, <u>SB 283</u> requires the board of education and Oregon Health Authority to review independently funded studies, and not just those backed and funded by industry. I would anticipate that such reviews would include, but not be limited to, biological and physiological and neurological and psychological effects of microwave radiation from wireless technology. I would hope that this would also include studies that deal with fatal development, brain and neural development, and more. This is to be carried out in schools, but it seems to me an even wider approach should be used to include at least those adults who work with children in any capacity, health care workers, and psychologists. It would also require schools to teach children to use wireless devices more safely. Children are certainly more vulnerable to microwave radiation, as they are growing biologically, and therefore more likely to experience problems. It would seem to me that children should understand and appreciate microwaves, radiation, scientific methods, and evidence gathering and analysing, and the risks and dangers from such technology on living beings.
