I am a resident of Portland, Oregon and a supporter of sexual assault survivors. This topic is very relevant to me as well as friends and family of mine.

Why is this Bill Important?

-Having sexual assault survivors go back to court to renew their restraining orders annually is traumatic. This restraining order needs to be extended to 5 years or more.

-Protecting vulnerable people, children, survivors of repeat sexual assault offenders, survivors of sexual assault by family is important and their protection deserves to be permanent.

What does it remedy?

-Removes the burden on the survivor to continually re-visit this traumatic event whenever a restraining order needs to be renewed.

-It protects the most vulnerable in the community, especially those who have jobs that do not allow them to take days off to go to court to review their restraining order.

- My position on this Bill is that I support it and I would like it to get passed.

- I support <u>SB 482</u> along with it's "-1" amendment.
