The prohibitation of chlorpyrifos use in Oregon could have irreversible economic and environmental impacts throughout agricultural communities. There are many situations in which farmers have no alternative products other than chlorpyrifos to protect their crops and investments. The ban on chlorpyrifos could limit the number of potential crops a grower can plant. Without proper crop rotation it can cause more pest resistance because of the lack of rotational chemistry.
