## Measure 11 Pathway to Prevention Workshop Highlights

Goals: Education, Prevention, Empowerment
When: Workshops started in March 2017 and is ongoing
Where: 17 Total Workshops reached over 500 students at 7 Portland Middle and High Schools
*PPS High Schools: $\mathbf{1}$ Workshop at Franklin High School, 4 workshops at Grant High School
*Alternative High Schools: 1 Workshop at each RAHS campus (4), 2 Workshops at Helensview
*Middle Schools: 4 Workshops at Ockley Green Middle School, 1 Workshop at Open School East
*Private School: 1 workshop at Portland Adventist Elementary School (Middle Schoolers)

## Key Findings:

Question 1: 13\% of students know what Measure 11 is before the workshop. About 76\% of students know what Measure 11 is after the workshop.

Question 6: 80\% of students falsely believe Measure 11 gives judges more discretion before the workshop. $\mathbf{2 0 \%}$ of students falsely believe Measure 11 gives judges more discretion after the workshop.

Question 9 : Before the workshop, over 66\% of students agree or strongly agree that laws and justice system are fair to youth like them. After the workshop, over 84\% disagree or strongly disagree.

Question 10: Before the workshop, 66\% of students disagree or strongly disagree that youth like them have the power to change the justice system. After the workshop, $\mathbf{8 2 \%}$ agree or strongly agree.
