Dear Legislators,

I believe in health freedom, and don't believe that vaccinations, especially with the schedule that exists now in this country, are healthy for every child. I believe that herd immunity is important, but not at the expense of the general health of the herd, and a vaccination schedule that is double that of many other countries. One should have the freedom to pick and choose vaccines and vaccine timing based on their individual health needs.
