My name is Janna Lewis, and I am a 42 year old mom of two amazing teenagers who are currently 13 and 15. I was born and raised here in Oregon and have a 25 year career in banking. I have a college undergrad degree in business. I am writing to you today for the first time ever. In fact, I am typically very un-involved in most political discussions and processes besides voting. But today I find myself extremely anxious and unsettled about the decisions being made for me and my family in the legislature. I am writing to plead with you to vote against HB3063.
