WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Directs school district board to adopt child sexual abuse prevention instructional program that addresses sex trafficking of children. First applies to the 2020-2021 school year. Effective July 1, 2020.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

-1 Establishes requirements for sex trafficking prevention programs, as specified.

BACKGROUND:

Oregon law requires school districts to adopt a child sexual abuse prevention instructional program for students in kindergarten through grade 12 and establishes requirements for the programs. Senate Bill 786 requires school districts to include sex trafficking prevention in their sexual abuse prevention programs.
