I have been an active member of the Portland arts community over the last five years, working with numerous arts organizations and specifically supporting arts access to communities of color. The Oregon Cultural Trust has been a vital resource to expand access to the arts for the Asian and Pacific Islander communities that I work with. With funding from the Oregon Cultural Trust, last October we were able to host our East Portland Arts & Literary Festival at Portland Community College - Southeast. Over 500 people participated in this two-day event featuring workshops, performances, a book and craft fair, and kid-friendly arts activities, all led by local artists of color. Through the Trust's support, we were able to tangibly invest in East Portland's under-resourced arts ecology, hire and support over 100 local artists, and build meaningful connections between artists and East Portland residents amidst turbulent social and political times.

The impact of the Oregon Cultural Trust is not to be understated. It is a true access point to opportunities for connection, community-building, and creativity. The Trust tax credit is an innovative and impactful funding mechanism, and the arts ecology for the state of Oregon would not be the same without it.
