WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Extends sunset of political contribution tax credit until January 1, 2026.

REVENUE: May have revenue impact, but no statement yet issued

FISCAL: No fiscal impact

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

-3 Limits credit to 50 percent of total contribution

BACKGROUND:

Originally enacted in 1969, the political contribution tax credit is a nonrefundable credit claimed against personal income taxes, in an amount that may not exceed \$50 per filer. The credit may not be taken by filers with an adjusted gross income of \$100,000 per filer.

In 2009, legislation was enacted to sunset a substantial number of tax credits, thereby requiring the Legislative Assembly to review those credits in regular intervals. Four years later, the political contribution tax credit was extended until January 1, 2020. House Bill 2134 renews the political contribution tax credit for another six years, extending the sunset until January 1, 2026.
