On behalf of the NW Energy Coalition, I am writing to express our support for HB 2494, which will extend the sunset for the public purpose charge until 2036.

The NW Energy Coalition is an alliance of about 100 environmental, civic and human service organizations, progressive utilities and businesses in Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Montana and British Columbia. We promote development of renewable energy and energy conservation, consumer protection, lowincome energy assistance, and fish and wildlife restoration on the Columbia and Snake rivers.

The public purpose charge provides many benefits to the ratepayers of Portland General Electric and PacifiCorp, including ensuring that least cost energy efficiency is procured as a resource to lower costs for customers, stimulating distributed renewable energy resource development, as well as proving energy assistance to low-income customers to help them afford their utility bills.

The public purpose charge energy efficiency and renewable energy services are currently provided through the Energy Trust of Oregon. These programs help customers of these two utilities reduce energy costs, increase productivity, contribute health and safety benefits, and reduce environmental impacts including greenhouse gas reductions. The Energy Trust is model organization revered across the country for its ability to produce significant results for Oregon households, businesses and industry. The Oregon Public Utility Commission oversees the organization and the current programs and management are effective and thorough – ensuring that utility customer resources are spent efficiently and effectively to reduce system costs and individual consumer bills.

Years ago, when the public purpose charge was established by this legislature in HB 1149, the leaders of Oregon created a system that functions well to ensure system benefits to customers of Pacificorp and Portland General Electric. Beyond those benefits to ratepayers, the public purpose charge has also provided jobs, economic development and carbon reduction that benefit the entire state.
