

Past Oregon shootings involving unsecured or stolen weapons

Oregon has seen a consistent pattern of gun violence attributed to the failures to securely store firearms, including the theft of the assault rifle used in the Clackamas Town Center Shooting.

Baker City

In November 2018, a two-year-old toddler gained access to an unsecured, loaded gun and shot himself in the head. He died hours later.

In November 2017, a seven-year-old child shot her two-year-old brother with a handgun that had been left loaded and unlocked in a car with the children.

In February 2017, an 18-year-old committed suicide with his father's gun that was left loaded and unattended in the family home.

In September 2015, a two-year-old toddler shot himself in the leg after a loaded handgun was left unsupervised on a coffee table.

In September 2014, an 11-year-old boy took a loaded, unlocked gun out of the glove box of his father's truck and used it in an attempted carjacking.

In March 2014, a five-year-old boy found his father's unsecured and loaded gun and shot himself in the stomach.

Clackamas

In December 2011, a 22-year-old man took an unsecured assault rifle from the home of a friend and opened fire in the Clackamas Town Center mall, killing two individuals and wounding another before he took his own life.
