My name is Jane Bicquette, and I live in rural Sherwood on acreage, and have lived in Oregon since 1990. I ask that you vote No on HB 2795 and HB 3118.

First, Oregon's initiative system promises voters that their wishes will be respected by their representatives. Whether the voters spoke in 1994 or 2018, our representatives and senators should respect their wishes. Voters told their Government not to use baiting and hounding to hunt cougars and bears. Period. Any vote for these two bills is a vote against the voice of the people of Oregon.

Second, trophy hunting, hounding and baiting practices, do not value life, do not support wildlife management, are cruel, unfair and inhumane.

Regarding HB 3118, Oregon Dept. of Fish and Wildlife should take responsibility for managing our cougars and bears with respectable stewardship and follow available science, and should not be allowed to overstate cougar populations to justify an anti-cougar agenda.
