

<u>More than one in three</u> Alzheimer's and dementia caregivers provide care to their parent or parent-in-law.


<u>Two-thirds</u> of Alzheimer's and dementia caregivers provide care to their parent or their parent-in-law.


Percent of dementia caregivers providing help with specific tasks
