Hello My name is Dan Kemper I have lived in Oregon my entire life. I don't want this law passed for many reasons. I might agree with some things in this bill if they were passed individually. I sat in the capital building on Tuesday April 2 2019. I heard people talking about locking guns up and how easy and cheep it was, and you can use things like biometric locks for quick access to your firearm. I personally have invested thousands of dollars in locking up my firearms. I have everything from a piece of junk cable lock that came with the firearm. That can be removed faster with a pair of wire cutters than with the key. To a safe that was several thousand dollars. I have several trigger locks for when I travel to a friends house. I also have a biometric safe I keep next to the bed. I bought the safe with the highest rated biometric lock. It was \$350 and when it works it is great but it fails to open about 50% of the time. I purchased this because I had someone living with me that suffered from depression. Now that she doesn't live in our home I have no need for it, but keep it just in case I do need it again. But one of my problems with this law is every person living in my house has a CHL. So a safe and reasonable way for me to store firearms is quite different than someone that has children living in the home.

This law would hold me liable if someone broke into my house and stole a firearm and used it in a crime. I also have a console vault in my car so if I travel to a gun free zone I can leave my firearm locked up. This law doesn't allow use of a console vault or a truck vault, regardless that law enforcement uses things like this every day to prevent un authorized use. These storage boxes have combo locks and keyed locks depending on the preference of the person buying it.

I also have a problem with making more gun free zones. People that have taken the time to get a CHL are not the problem and passing a law preventing people from carrying a concealed handgun in public buildings is not going to protect people. My wife works at a hospital in the Portland area that had an active shooter scare. I will never forget when she called me and told me the hospital was in lockdown because of an active shooter. The first question I asked her is if she had a gun on her. She said no because the hospital is a gun free zone and she could loose her job if she brought a gun into the hospital. She later told me she had several other coworkers ask her if she had a gun. They were all disappointed she fallowed the rule. Banning CHL holders from carrying in public buildings is a waste of time that isn't going to do anything. They hav already passed the ever so critical background check that the anti gun groups have been asking for.

I could keep going with problems with this 45 page law that was made public about a week ago. I ask you to vote NO on this law and address them on an individual basis!
