Organization

 The District was organized under ORS Chapter 267 to provide transit services within the Salem-Keizer urban growth boundary.

• The District has a memorandum of understanding with Marion and Polk counties to provide transit services to these two counties.



Governance

 The seven-member Board of Directors guides the district on fiscal and policy issues.

 With recent changes in Oregon law, seats on the Board become governor-appointed positions rather than elected, in July 2019.


