Measure Description:

Authorizes office of Long Term Care Ombudsman to hire up to 10 deputy ombudsmen.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Long Term Care Ombudsman (LTCO)

Summary of Fiscal Impact:

Analysis:

HB 3413 authorizes the Long Term Care Ombudsman (LTCO) to hire up to 10 deputy ombudsmen.

Currently, there are seven existing deputy ombudsmen positions in the Office of the Long Term Care Ombudsman. The staffing and startup cost for one Program Analyst 2 position to serve as a deputy ombudsman for the 21 months of the 2019-21 biennium is \$191,890. The personal services and related services and supplies for one Program Analyst 2 position to serve as a deputy ombudsman for the 2021-23 biennium is \$205,049.

The fiscal impact of \$575,670 General Fund 3 positions (2.64 FTE) for the 2019-21 biennium; and \$615,147 General Fund and 3 positions (3.00 FTE) in the table above assumes that LTCO hires three additional ombudsmen, meeting the maximum limit authorized by the measure.
