- Contributes to health and safety of all residents, while reducing greenhouse gases



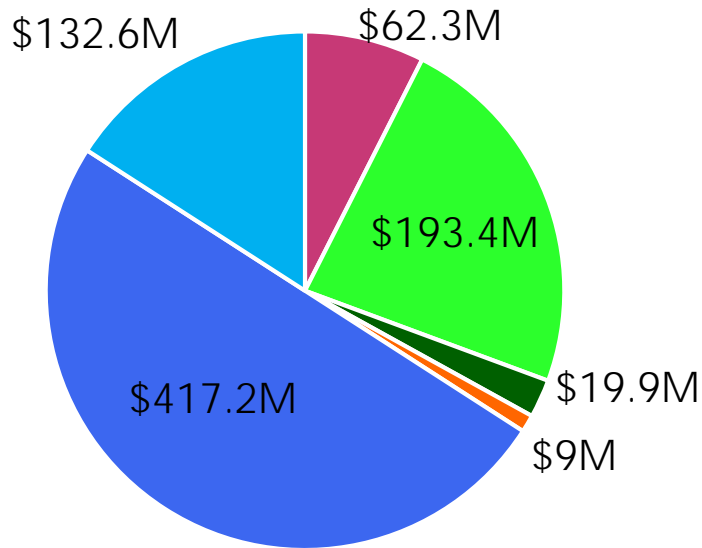

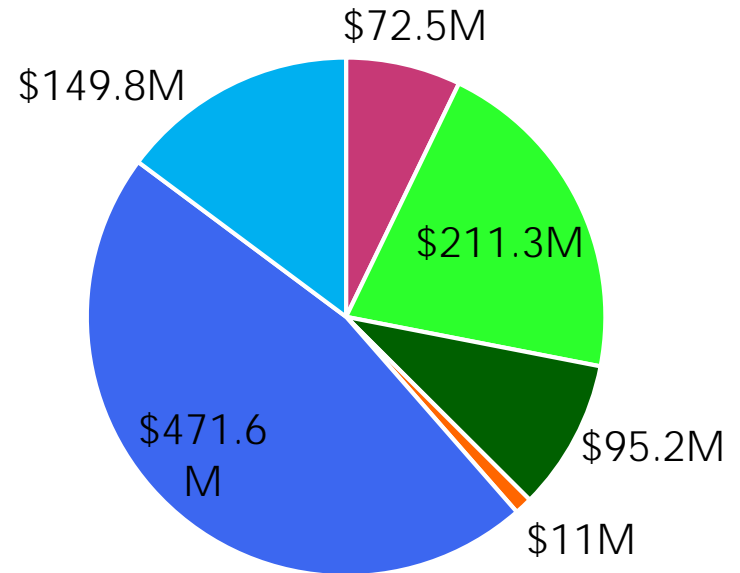
Public Transportation Funding Overview

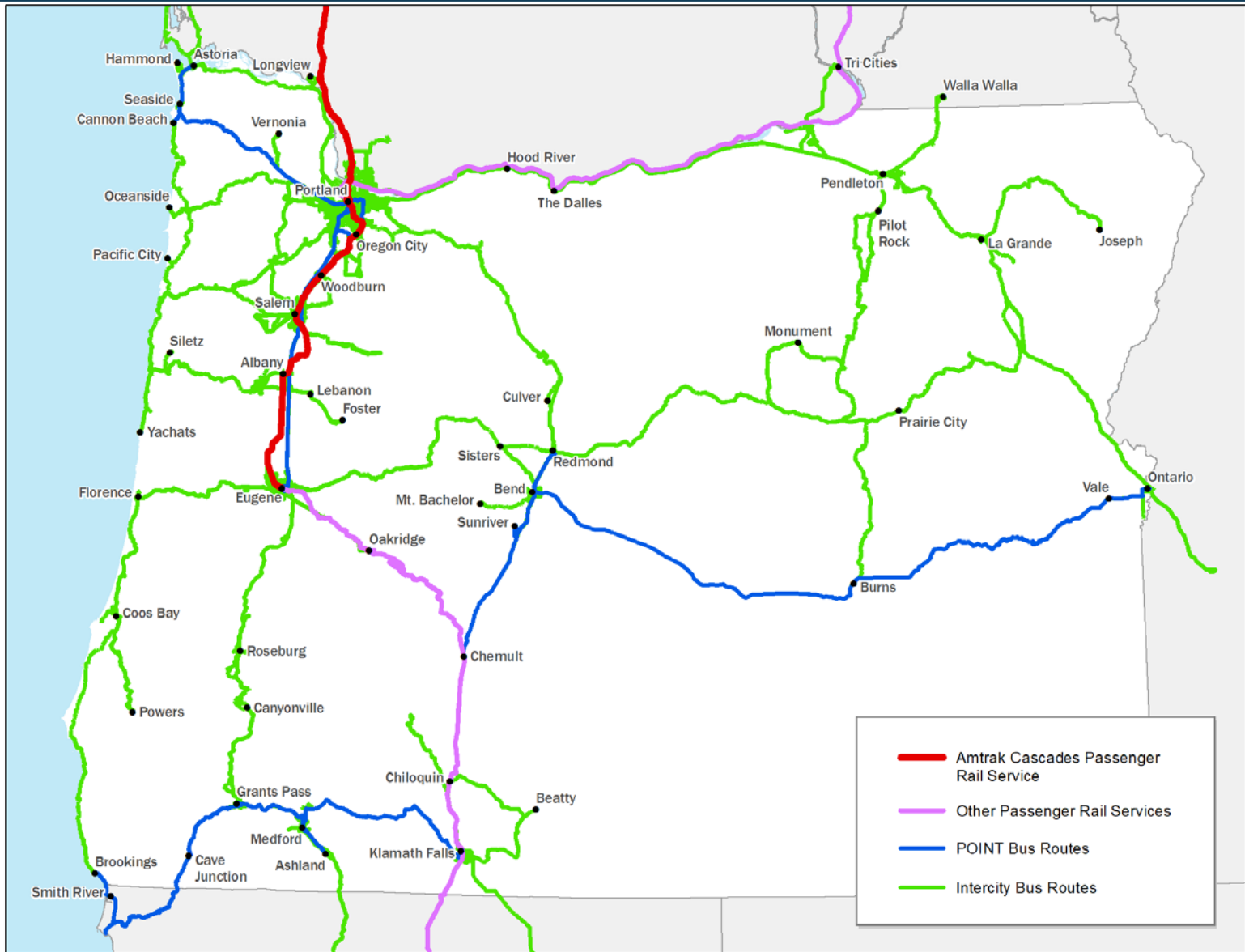

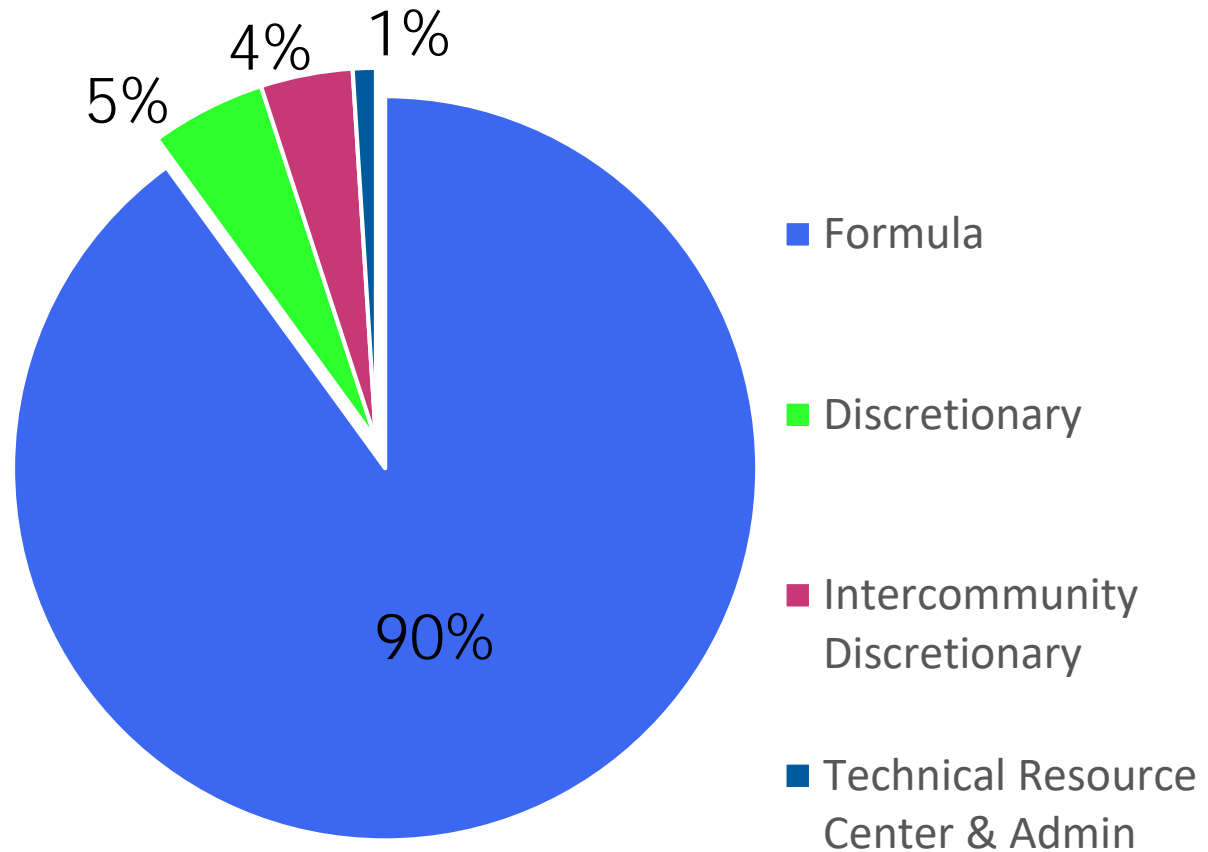


Statewide Transportation Improvement Fund

- Improve service to low-income communities
- Fund low-income fare programs
- Procure low or no emission buses
- Improve frequency and reliability
- Improve coordination to enhance connectivity
- Expand transit for high school students

STIF Implementation

- Summer 2018 - Rulemaking
- Summer/Fall 2018 - Solicitation
- March 2019 - 18 plans and Formula funds approved
- May 2019 - First distributions
- Summer 2019 - Discretionary and intercommunity awards
- February 2020 - Report to legislature
