## RE: SB 5025, Higher Education Coordinating Committee - OHSU

Dear Joint Ways & Means Subcommittee on Education,

The Oregon Society of Physician Assistants (OSPA) supports the budget for the Oregon Health & Science University for the 2019-21 biennium.

Our organization is the professional society that represents physician assistants (PAs) in Oregon. As you may know, OHSU is a national leader in their PA program, which is consistently ranked within the top 10 PA programs in the United States. In addition, OHSU is a premier medical school training hundreds physicians, dentists, pharmacists, nurses, paramedics, and many other health care professionals every year who go on to provide medical care all across our state.

OHSU's medical education system is critical to meeting the healthcare workforce needs of Oregon. The Physician Assistant program within the School of Medicine trains between 36 and 40 PAs a year by preparing PAs for the practice of medicine and delivery of team-based primary and specialty care.
