As a physician, I worked at Virginia Garcia Memorial Health Center, a community health center which serves many immigrants, including migrant farmworkers. I heard from them how important it is to be able to drive, especially to work, to doctor's appointments, and to school. Often their workplacesnurseries, berry farms, orchards—were only accessible by car. Although public transportation by bus or light rail is available in the Portland metro area, there are few other cities and towns in Oregon that have public transportation. Driving is the only real option in rural Oregon.

As an Oregonian who drives, I know that our roads and highways are much safer when all of those driving know the rules of the road and how to be a safe driver. Allowing all drivers in Oregon to apply for a license and pass a driving test is just common sense.

Please support and pass HB 2015 to make Oregon a safer and more equitable place.
