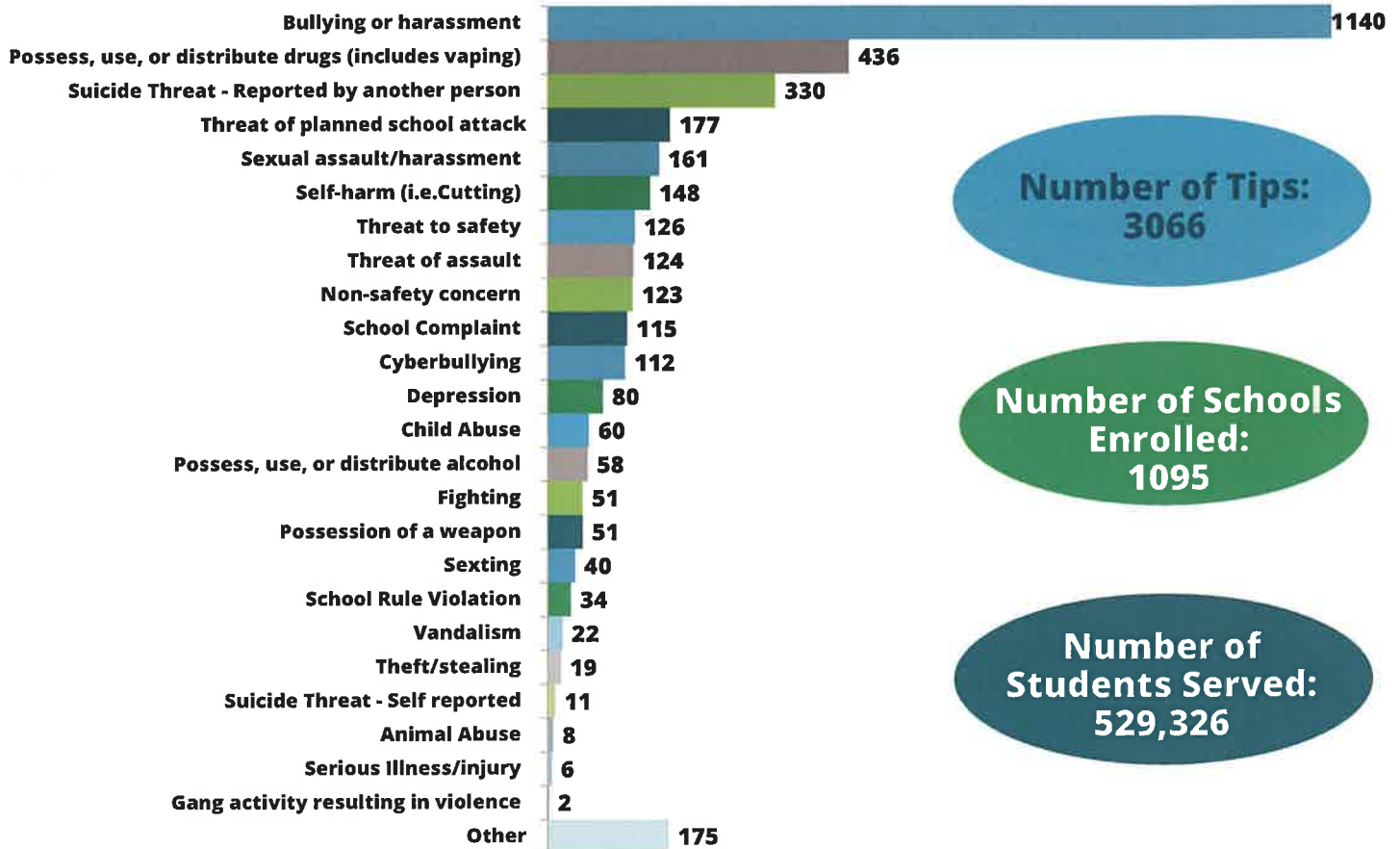

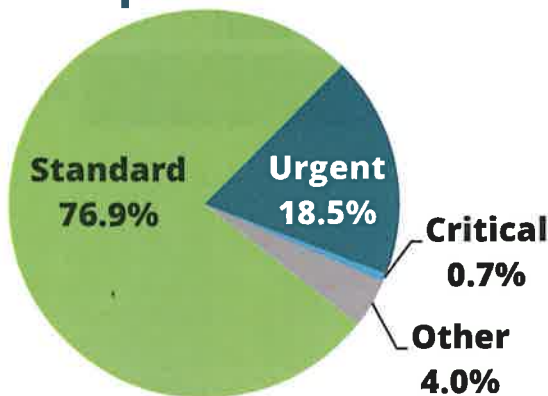

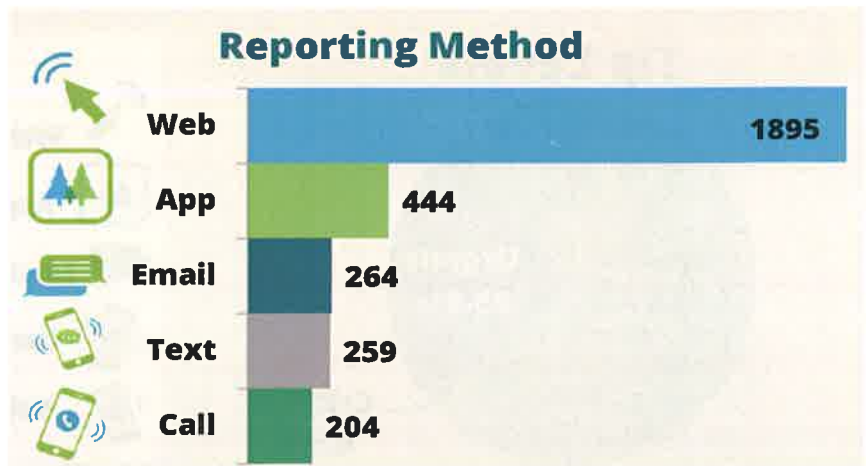
Incident Types*

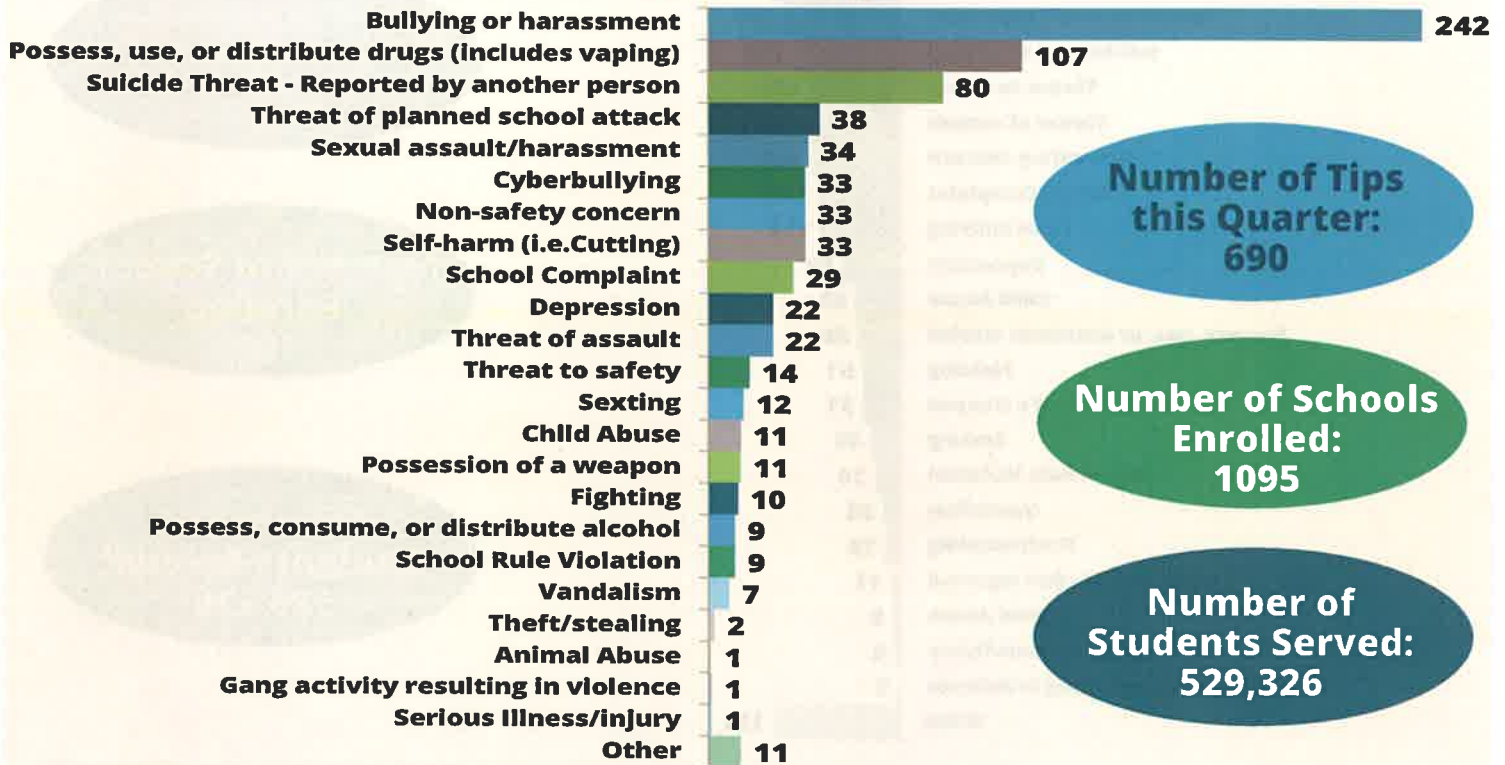

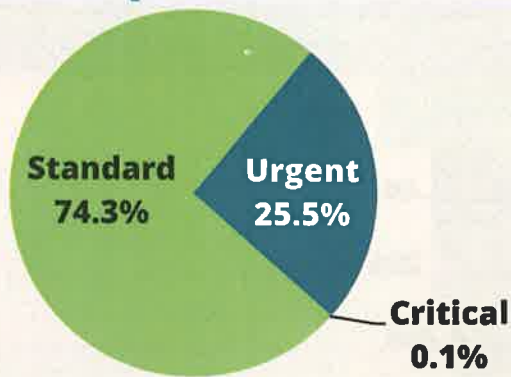
Executive Summary Highlights for this quarter:

•January 31, 2019 marked the two year anniversary of SafeOregon and KOIN 6 produced a segment depicting the life saving aspects of the tip line •Governor Brown, Oregon students, and The Oregon Task Force on School Safety recognized SafeOregon’s contribution to school safety in a press conference at the State Capitol on February 12 •In partnership with RTI International, funded through a National Institute of Justice grant, SafeOregon helped create the nationally distributed “School Tip Line Toolkit: A Blueprint for Implementation and Sustainability” published this quarter •Promotion of SafeOregon has increased significantly at schools and in communities as can be seen through supportive social media postings and school marketing efforts.

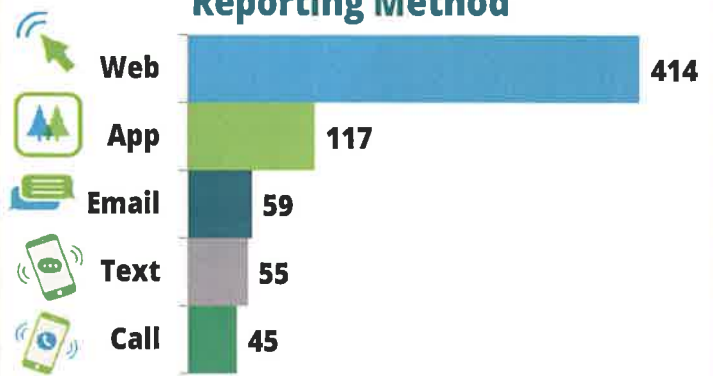
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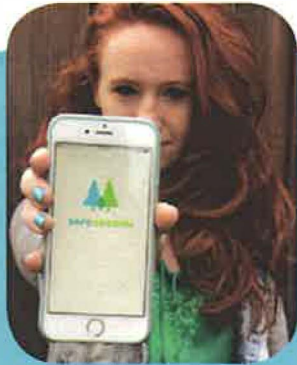

WHAT IS SAFEOREGON?

SafeOregon is a tip line.

Did someone hurt you?

Do you know about someone who *might* hurt you or other people?

Do you know about a danger to students, school staff, or your school?

Are you struggling?

Do you need help from an adult and you're not sure who to tell?

You can tell SafeOregon.

SAFEOREGON IS PRIVATE.

SafeOregon is checked 24/7.

Your tip is private. Your name will not be shared unless you want to share it.

People who work at SafeOregon will look at your tip. Then they send it to school employees and possibly law enforcement.

WHAT CAN I REPORT?

You can use SafeOregon to report:

- Bullying in person
- Bullying online
- Safety threats
- Fighting
- Drugs
- Alcohol
- Weapons
- Talk of suicide, depression, or people who want to hurt themselves or others
- Abuse
- Sexual assault

DON'T BREAK THE LAW!

Sending a fake tip to SafeOregon is against the law. False reports, pranks or jokes may be investigated by police.
