I am a resident of Oregon and supporter of the human rights which are also the right to safety of sex workers.

This bill is important because sex workers are some of the most vulnerable members of the community. The line of work puts them in close contact with people from all backgrounds in often very vulnerable settings. Right now, sex workers cannot safely report when they get assaulted, attacked, injured by ANY client because they will likely get prosecuted by the police for prostitution or attempted prostitution. Which means if they are exposed to violence, they CURRENTLY CANNOT seek protection from law enforcement or even approaching emergency medical help. Passing this bill would allow the basic human right for a vulnerable community to seek the same level minimum level of protection all people have in Oregon without backlash.
