Abused animals can suffer extensive injuries, and it is only fair that upon conviction they are responsible for reimbursement when there are significant medical expenses.

The reality is that many animals would otherwise be euthanized if it weren't for generous agencies, veterinary professionals and other compassionate people in Oregon who care for abused animals. The non-profits, taxpayers, and residents of our state should not have to foot the medical bill for an abuser's acts of violence or negligence.
