

Oregon's Measure 11 Legislative Bill Support Survey Results (Summer 2018)

Question #1: When asked about changing the starting **age of Measure 11 mandatory minimum sentencing** in Oregon, **62%** of Oregonians do not support MMS and **78%** of Oregonians support either repealing Measure 11 or changing the age of eligibility to 21 or 25 years old.

Question #2: When asked about reducing the **mandatory minimum sentence lengths**, **70%** of Oregonians do not support MMS at all, while **86%** of Oregonians support **either repealing Measure 11 or reducing** all mandatory minimum **sentence lengths by either 50% or 75%**.

Question #3: When asked *“Do you support youth **felony** convictions being cleared from their adult record?”*, about **72%** of Oregonians **support** youth Measure 11 convictions and plea deal convictions being an expungable juvenile record.

Question #4: **70%** of Oregonians support **second looks** to determine eligibility for early release **every 25% of their sentence (Quarterly eligibility)**.

Question #5: When asked, *“Do you support **removing Robbery II and Assault II** from the list of 21 Measure 11 offenses?”*, **73%** of Oregonians support the **removal** of Robbery II and Assault II from the list of Measure 11 offenses.

Question #6: When asked *“Do you support Measure 11 modifications (reforms) to apply **retroactively** to individuals previously charged with a Measure 11 crime?”*, **81%** of Oregonians support Measure 11 modifications to apply retroactively to individuals previously charged with a Measure 11 crime.
