WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Allows the Director of the Oregon Department of Aviation to request the Department of Transportation to provide central business services to the Department of Aviation.

Senate floor vote: 28-0

Measure has minimal fiscal impact, no revenue impact

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

The Aviation Board was formed in 1921 to develop a system of airports throughout Oregon. The Oregon Department of Aviation manages all state airports; registers airports, pilots, and aircraft; and collaborates with the Federal Aviation Administration to manage the Statewide Capital Improvement Program. Currently, the Department of Transportation provides central business operating services to the Department of Aviation. Some services include daily processing for accounts payable and receivable, financial revenue reports, and internal audits.

Senate Bill 53 authorizes the Director of the Oregon Department of Aviation to request the Department of Transportation to provide central business services to the Department of Aviation.
