SB 60 A STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Changes registration for volunteer health care professionals claiming liability limitation from annual to a biennial requirement. Adds acupuncturists and podiatric physicians to licensees eligible to register for liability limitation exemption. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

REVENUE: No revenue impact.

FISCAL: No fiscal impact.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Changing annual registration to biennial to regulatory streamline the program; reduce administrative burden
- Inclusion of all health care professionals licensed by the Oregon Medical Board

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

Health care professionals that provide services without compensation may be eligible to register with the Oregon Medical Board (OMB) for a program that limits the practitioner's liability for injury, death, or other loss. In addition to registration with the OMB, limitation of liability requires informed consent and a signed notification by the patient or the patient's authorized representative. The liability limitation program is currently available to:

- Physicians
- Nurses
- Nurse practitioners
- Clinical nurse specialists
- Physician assistants
- Dental hygienists
- Dentists
- Pharmacists
- Optometrists
- Naturopathic physicians

The Oregon Medical Board reports that in 2018, 266 physicians and physician assistants registered for the program. Senate Bill 60 A changes registration for the liability limitation program from an annual to a biennial requirement to align the registration with health care professionals' biennial license renewal. The measure also adds acupuncturists and podiatric physicians to the licensees eligible to register for the program.
