Everyone, including for students who are not from this United States, should have the same rights as a student who was born in the United States. When you all are considering pieces of legislation that are affecting undocumented students throughout the session, I would urge you all to ask yourselves: Are y'all actually helping all Oregon students or just serving as a function?

When all Oregon students can continue through grad school obtain advanced degrees,
Oregon wins. These bills would maximize the outcomes of Oregon's education investments by
helping more Oregon students afford and complete undergrad then move on to grad school or
professional licensing opportunities, which help lead to stable and fruitful careers. Clarifying that
TE applies to grad school would remove an arbitrary educational limit that exists for some
students. Please show that you support undocumented Oregon students by voting yes on SB 859.
